FIRST FIFTY 2021: NEW TRADITIONS

COLLOQUY: SOLANGE ROBERDEAU

3 JUNE – 11 JULY 2021

This exhibition points to the communication, abstract or literal, that occurs throughout the process of making with materials. A colloquy, or dialogue, between artist, viewers, and between sets of images displayed together, is the artist's theme for the installation. Solange Roberdeau lives and works in Northern California.

NORTH AND SOUTH: BERNICE ABBOTT'S U.S. ROUTE 1

29 JULY – 12 SEPT 2021

This exhibition of fifty images visualizes Berenice Abbott's summer journey in 1954 along the length of U.S. Route 1. Beginning in New York City, she and two companions traveled south to Key West. From there, she turned around and drove north to the highway's terminus in Fort Kent, Maine, arriving in September. During the trip Abbott made more than four hundred 8x10 inch photographs, and more than two thousand smaller images using her Rolieflex camera. This exhibition is organized by the Syracuse University Art Museum.

KEVIN BURT IN CONCERT | **Thursday, June 3** at 6:00 p.m. in the Hearst Sculpture Garden For nearly 3 decades, Kevin Burt, Iowa Blues Hall of Fame member (class of 2019), has been mesmerizing audiences with his powerfully smooth and soulful vocals. Paired with his unique harmonica and guitar presentation along with his quick wit, Burt engages with his audience touching their souls while tickling their funny bones. Burt (born and raised in Waterloo, IA) dispelled the myth that there was no such thing as Iowa Blues by becoming the first artist in the 35-year history of the International Blues Challenge (2018) to sweep the awards by claiming top prizes in three categories: Solo/Duo, Solo/Duo Guitar and Harmonica. While Burt spends a lot more time on the road these days, he keeps to his Iowa roots by continuing with his Blues in the Schools program and supporting community events.
